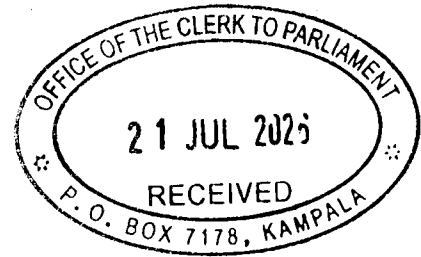




PARLIAMENT OF UGANDA



RT HON SPEAKER AND MEMBERS, I MOVE UNDER RULE 58 OF THE RULES OF PROCEDURE OF PARLIAMENT TO MOVE A MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION OF PARLIAMENT TO PAY TRIBUTE TO THE LATE HONORABLE RETIRED GENERAL MOSES ALI, MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT FOR ADJUMANI WEST COUNTY, AND FORMER SECOND DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER OF UGANDA, FOR HIS ILLUSTRIOUS AND DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE REPUBLIC OF UGANDA.

(Moved under Rule 58 of the Rules of Procedure of Parliament)

WHEREAS the Parliament of Uganda received, with deep sorrow, the sad news of the demise of Rt Hon. retired Gen Moses Ali, Member of Parliament for Adjumani West County, which occurred on Saturday 18th July, 2026, at Nakasero Hospital;

AWARE THAT the Rt Hon. (Retired) Gen Moses Ali has had an illustrious career spanning more than fifty years, serving in various capacities in the military, civil and public service of Uganda, where he played a crucial role in the peace, national unity, stability and social and economic transformation of Uganda;

NOTING THAT Rt Hon. (Retired) Gen Moses Ali was a courageous soldier and an astute leader whose personal traits of selflessness, commitment to public interest,

strict accountability and ethical transparency enabled him to serve the people of Uganda with distinction in the following key positions:-

- a) Member of Parliament, Adjumani West County, from 2016 to date;
- b) Second Deputy Prime Minister and Deputy Leader of Government Business in Parliament, from 2021 to 2026;
- c) First Deputy Prime Minister and Deputy Leader of Government Business in Parliament, from 2016 to 2021;
- d) Third Deputy Prime Minister and Deputy Leader of Government Business in Parliament, from 2011 to 2016;
- e) Member of Parliament, East Moyo County, from 2011 to 2016;
- f) First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Relief, Disaster Preparedness and Refugees, 2003;
- g) Second Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Disaster Preparedness and Refugees, 2001;
- h) Member of Parliament, East Moyo County, from 2001 to 2006;
- i) Second Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Internal Affairs, 2000 - 2003;
- j) Second Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Tourism, Trade and Industry, 1996 - 2000;
- k) Member of Parliament, East Moyo County from 1996 to 2001;

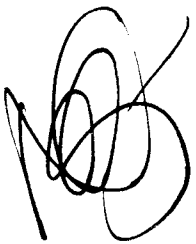
- l) Third Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Tourism, Wildlife and Antiquities, 1995 - 1996;
- m) Minister of Tourism, Wildlife and Antiquities, 1994 - 1995;
- n) Member of Uganda's Constituent Assembly representing East Moyo, 1994;
- o) Chairman of the Federation of Uganda Football Association, 1994;
- p) Member of the National Resistance Council (NRC) for East Moyo, 1989;
- q) Minister for Youth, Culture and Sports, 1986;
- r) Minister of Finance, 1975;
- s) Chairman Central Tender Board, 1976-1978;
- t) Member of Makerere University Council, 1976 to 1978;
- u) Chairman, Valuation Committee (Responsible for negotiating with Governments, whose Citizens left property in Uganda in 1972), 1976 to 1978;
- v) Governor in the African Development Bank and African Development Fund, 1978
- w) Chairman, Board of Governors of the Islamic Development Bank, 1978-1979;
- x) Teacher at Koch Goma Church of Uganda Primary School and Anaka Catholic Girls School, 1967-1968;



RECOGNISING THAT Rt Hon. retired General Moses Ali was a patriot who served in Uganda Army, the Uganda

National Rescue Front (UNRF-II) and the Uganda People's Defence Forces (UPDF) and attained the following ranks and awards:-

- (a) Commissioned to the Rank of 2nd Lt and appointed Officer in charge of Training in the Uganda Paratrooper School, 1969;
- (b) He was promoted to the rank of Major and appointed Commander of the Paratrooper School, 1971;
- (c) He was promoted to the rank of Colonel, 1972;
- (d) appointed Minister of Provincial administration (Interior) in 1973;
- (e) He was promoted to the rank of Brigadier, 1974;
- (f) He was decorated with the following medals:
 - (i) Distinguished Service Order;
 - (ii) Military Cross;
 - (iii) Operational and Republic Medals;
 - (iv) the 2nd highest honour of the Islamic Republic of Mauritius, 1975;
- (g) He was Commissioned into the National Resistance Army (NRA) at the rank of Major General, 1986;
- (h) He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant General, 2003;
- (i) Thereafter, promoted to the rank of General in 2012.



APPRECIATING THAT Rt Hon. Retired General Moses Ali contributed to the post-colonial restoration of democratic rule in Uganda and participated-

- (a) in the fight against authoritarianism by founding and leading the Uganda National Rescue Front (UNRF II), a West Nile-based rebel movement that fought against the dictatorships of the 1980s;
- (b) in the making of the 1995 Constitution of the Republic of Uganda, as a Member of the Constituent Assembly;
- (c) in the negotiations between the Uganda National Rescue Front (UNRF-II) rebel group and the Government of Uganda, which culminated in a formal ceasefire agreement and final peace deal, which officially ended the insurgency in the West Nile region and led to the incorporation of former combatants of the UNRF-II into the Uganda People's Defence Forces;
- (d) Supported H.E Gen Yoweri Kaguta Museveni in peace efforts to end the insurgency of the Lord's Resistance Army (LRA), in northern Uganda and was instrumental in championing the formulation and enactment of the Amnesty Act, Cap. 316,..... which granted pardon to fighters who denounced rebellion;



COGNISANT THAT Rt Hon. retired General Moses Ali was a diligent leader who supported H.E Gen Yoweri Kaguta Museveni in shaping the destiny of Uganda and served Uganda with dedication and patriotism for over fifty years, as described above;

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved that Parliament of Uganda:

1. Collectively conveys its deepest condolences to the bereaved family, the people of West Nile sub-region and the people of Uganda, for the loss of a distinguished and gallant citizen of this country;
2. Appreciates the distinguished service rendered by the late Rt. Hon. retired Gen Moses Ali to the people of Uganda.

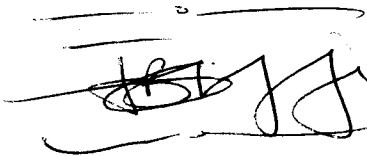
