



PARLIAMENT OF UGANDA

MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION OF PARLIAMENT TO REINSTATE PARLIAMENTARY BUSINESS THAT LAPSED UPON THE DISSOLUTION OF THE 11TH PARLIAMENT

(Moved under Rules 58 and 245(2) of the Rules of Procedure of Parliament)

WHEREAS Article 77 of the Constitution establishes the Parliament of Uganda and further provides that the term of Parliament shall be five years from the date of its first sitting after a general election;

AND WHEREAS Article 96 of the Constitution provides that Parliament shall stand dissolved upon the expiration of its term;

AWARE THAT the 11th Parliament was dissolved on the 24th day of May, 2026, having served its five-year term;

NOTING THAT at the time of the dissolution of the 11th Parliament, there was parliamentary business pending consideration by the House and Committees of Parliament;

RECOGNISING THAT rule 245(1) of the Rules of Procedure provides that parliamentary business pending before the House or a Committee during a term of Parliament lapses upon the dissolution of Parliament;

APPRECIATING THAT rule 245 (2) and (4) of the Rules of Procedure authorises Parliament to reinstate, by resolution, within the first fourteen sittings of the first session of Parliament, parliamentary business that lapsed upon the dissolution of the previous Parliament;

COGNISANT THAT parliamentary business that lapsed upon the dissolution of the 11th Parliament is of a vital nature, relating to statutory reports, petitions and statutory instruments, the consideration and approval of which is a preserve of Parliament;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by this House that the following parliamentary business which lapsed upon the dissolution of the 11th Parliament be reinstated-

- (1) The Political Parties and Organisations (Inter-Party Organisation for Dialogue) Regulations, 2025;
- (2) Annual Report of the Auditor General to Parliament for the audit year ended 31st December, 2025;
- (3) National Planning Authority Annual Performance Report for Financial Year 2024/2025;
- (4) Petroleum Fund Annual Report for the year ended June, 2025;
- (5) The 28th Annual Report of the Uganda Human Rights Commission on the State of Human Rights and Freedoms in Uganda in 2025;
- (6) Annual Performance Report of the Education Service Commission;
- (7) Petition by National Sports Officers Association (NSOA) over persistent discrimination of sports officers as non-scientists, lack of structure and inadequate welfare to support sports delivery services at Local Governments in Uganda;
- (8) Petition by Uganda Technical and Vocational Trainers' Union (UTVTU) over continuous neglect of the TVET sub-sector (TVET trainers) and the urgent need for Parliamentary intervention;
- (9) Investigation into the destruction of Zoka Forest;
- (10) Inquiry into complaints by Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) on historical leadership and governance challenges at Uganda National Bureau of Standards (UNBS).

- (11) Report on a recommendation for waiver of tax arrears for New Plan Limited;
- (12) Report on a recommendation for a waiver of tax arrears for Fresh Cuts Uganda Limited; and
- (13) Report on a recommendation for waiver of tax arrears for Innovations for Poverty Action; and
